Program Overviews

Interfaith Hunger Project

- In 2021 the Hunger Project served 12,501 unduplicated persons with 30,582 loads of groceries. Each person was allowed food one time per month.
- Homebound persons received 1678 loads of groceries delivered by volunteers one time a month.
- Each load consisted of meat protein, bread, milk, vegetables, fruit, soup, pasta, sauces, beans, and many other items of necessity.

Eyecare Program

- In the 8 months services were available in 2021 we served 91 unduplicated persons with 481 services. 91 people were able to see properly again, all at no charge.

Affordable Housing

- In 2021 we had an 88.33% of occupancy with 9560 days of housing for 39 tenants in our affordable apartments and homes.

Pearl Longbine Emergency Youth Shelter

- We provided 2862 total days and nights of safe shelter to 82 at risk youth.

Immigration Legal Services

- We served 304 unduplicated persons, 116 of those were refugees.
- All persons are in the country legally from 29 countries.

School Impact

- We helped 132 persons learn English and U.S. Civics.

Youth Mentoring

- We helped 17 youth adapt to the U.S. culture.

New Arrivals of Refugees

- We helped 48 people from other countries brought to us by the US government.
- Of the 48, 19 were Afghan refugees.

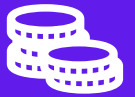
